Dear Parish Family.

The longer I am here as your pastor, the more I grow in admiration and amazement at what is accomplished here at St. Mary. I continue to marvel at the generosity of the St. Mary Parish Community. Thank you!

Operating a parish is like running a business; but unlike a business, we must rely solely upon the generosity of our parishioners for our income and resources. The parish must trust in God that our parishioners will continue to support His church so that we can continue to serve our community. As your Pastor, it is my responsibility to teach and reinforce what God is asking of you through Scriptures and to help you learn how to live your life as a Faithful Catholic. When I became your pastor, I promised you that I would give you all the tools and resources you would need to grow in your faith and become disciples of Christ. I hope I am continuing to live up to my promise each year through my homilies, through the various studies we offer, the formation of groups where knowledge can be gained with discussion, the resources in the Formation Station at the back of church, book giveaways, and through a free-to-you, subscription to FORMED.org. At least once per year, I try to include teachings on stewardship and what that means in our Catholic lives and to our parish. Stewardship will be the topic over the next few weeks.

My top 3 pastoral priorities are Souls, School, and Space. This document supports my commitment to those areas of priority and presents to you the very real challenge we have at St. Mary Church and some of the many beautiful blessings and ministries we are given. We don't give to receive. But if we give to God, freely, without reservation, we will receive more than we give in different ways. The Word of God confirms this. St. Paul writes: "Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things, always having all you need, you may have an abundance for every good work". As it is also written: "Consider this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 'He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor, His righteousness endures forever.' The one who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed and increase the harvest of your righteousness." (2 Cor 9: 6-10)

As you reflect on your annual commitment to the parish, please remember that we are counting on you! Consider your journey of faith within the church, school, and religious education program. Consider the memories and the impact this parish, school, and religious education program have had and will have in your life. Then, "Giving from the Heart" and trusting God, make your decision.

### God cannot be outdone in generosity.

# **UNDERSTANDING SACRIFICIAL GIVING**

Our gift of physical life, that of our spouse and children, the freedoms we enjoy, our abilities to learn and work, skills, talents and yes - even our income are all gifts from God. God has blessed each one of us in ways beyond our comprehension or expectation.

Each one of us must assess our current level of giving and consider if this level adequately reflects our gratitude for who we are and what we have. It is not so much what we give back to God as much as it is the attitude with which the gift is made. If we are giving out of habit, the same \$25.00 we have been giving over the last few years habitually, is it sincere? If we are giving the change left in our pocket or what is left over after paying bills, is it sincere? Possibly, however more than likely, we really have not given our commitment close attention.

Sacrificial Giving consists of the following five dimensions:

1. Plan your giving. The planning process can be a time for spiritual consideration of values and priorities. The outcome should be a conscious commitment to giving with a plan for making the gift. (See examples below)

- 2. Make it proportionate. Base the amount on your means and consider what has been given to you. The bible recommends giving back a tenth (tithe). Could 5% be given to the church and the other 5% spread among your other favorite charities?
- 3. Your gift should be a sacrifice. If you can give your gift and not notice the impact on you and your life, then it is not sacrificial. (Consider ways to make it sacrificial)
- 4. Give thanks. Your commitment is both personal and communal. Celebrate the gifts you have received at offertory collection time when you place your envelope in the basket. Say a personal prayer of thanksgiving for all God has given you as it is placed at the altar.
- 5. No conditions. Your gift should be a gift. Sacrificial giving does not buy anything and should be given without the expectation of getting something back. Give freely.

Ways in which to make it sacrificial!

1. Give an additional amount equal to the first fast food or beverage purchase on Monday morning. Doing without those
